Introduction

Due to COVID-19 and at the direction of the Governor of New Jersey, the district has developed a comprehensive virtual learning plan. This plan will provide a virtual learning model of instruction to continue to provide academic learning opportunities for students. Parents/Guardians can view the district virtual learning policy and plan handbook on the district website. The LEA will ensure essential employees are identified and a list is provided to the county office at the time of the LEA's transition to remote or virtual instruction.

This plan addresses how students will receive instruction. **Option 1 -** Used for students who may be sick or need to quarantine due to COVID-19 when all students are in school full time, following a regular school day schedule. **Option 2 -** Used in the case that the Governor orders either full virtual instruction or virtual instruction as an option during an alternate schedule. Specifically if there is a closure lasting more than three consecutive days due to a declared public health emergency, declared state of emergency, or a directive by the appropriate health agency or officer to institute a public health closure.

The district also is cognizant of the importance of recognizing, as well as supporting the social and emotional needs of our students during this difficult time. This virtual plan will not only address academic programs, but also social, emotional, and health related resources, as well as programs. Students with special needs, specifically special education students with IEP's and 504 plan students, BSI/Title 1 students, as well as English Language Learners will also be provided with customized programs to address each students' goals and objectives. If a parent/guardian chooses to utilize the virtual option for instruction, they will need to register their child as directed.

The plan will also address how we have assisted our students in grades PK to 8 with 1:1 technology resources and support for internet connectivity. Our district continues to utilize services from both LinkIt and Let's Go Learn to not only assess and collect data (baseline, benchmark, skills based, and curricular), but also give students an online platform that individually remediates and enriches their Math and ELA skills. This information for each student is stored in a data warehouse that is accessible virtually. It allows teachers to monitor progress and reteach skills as needed. The Let's Go Learn program also allows students to work at their own pace, which the teacher can monitor virtually and provide interventions. In addition, virtual labs and interactive programs in Science and Social Studies will complement these online learning experiences. Lastly, the district utilizes several ELA, Math, and Science online learning programs that will continue to be used during distance learning. These are the Progressive Math and Science programs, as well as the online components of Superkids and Lucy Calkins Readers and Writers Workshop Model.

New formats and modes of learning will be addressed in this plan. It will afford students new opportunities to discover their talents, interests, independence, and also foster more individualized instruction and personalized learning to meet their needs. Through the use of various video communications and online resources, our staff will be able to provide our students

with engaging and motivating programs that focus on the whole child. Not only will the district use these methods to focus on the core curriculum (ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies), but we will also tie in special area curriculum (Physical Education, Art, and Music) to further enhance students' learning of this subject matter. In addition, supports focusing on each student's well being will also be provided. This plan will have several components included, these components will focus on scheduling of services, digital platforms and resources, content delivery, attendance procedures and reporting, instructional support and expectations, assessments and grading, wellness supports, transition plan back to in person learning, and communication of district policies. The key components to be defined are as follows:

- *Content Delivery* is an online resource students will use for core instructional areas and supplemental resources that will be used to enhance learning.
- *Digital Resources* will provide steps, links, websites, etc. to staff, parents/guardians, and students that will be used for learning and support purposes.
- *Instructional Support* defines the expectations and supports the district will provide to staff, students, and parents/guardians. Assessment measures will also be addressed.

Schedules

Students in grades K-8 will follow the schedules highlighted below:

OPTION 1-

If any student is out due to COVID-19 illness or needs to quarantine, they will participate in a live stream format. The schedule follows the regular school day schedule.

OPTION 2 -

Specifically if there is a closure lasting more than three consecutive days due to a declared public health emergency, declared state of emergency, or a directive by the appropriate health agency or officer to institute a public health closure. If the district needs to follow or offer a full virtual plan the following will occur. PK students will have a schedule shared with parents/guardians from the PK teacher. The following instructional schedule guidelines are expected at a minimum each day:

- Special areas (PE, Art, Music) will be scheduled on a rotating basis for each class to
 participate in. This will be planned with the general education teacher to avoid conflicts.
 In addition, integration through collaboration should occur, including working with the
 CST and guidance counselors to support social/emotional needs.
- Related services (Counseling, Speech/Language, OT and PT) will be provided as per the student's IEP or 504 plan, specific to the time and frequency. This should be planned with the subject matter teacher to avoid conflicts.
- Additional counseling services may be provided to students in need 1 time per week.
- Nursing services and supports will be provided and scheduled as needed.
- ELL students will be scheduled for services for a minimum of 30 minutes per day. This should be planned with the subject matter teacher to avoid conflicts.
- SPED ICR teachers will collaborate with the general education teacher and participate in virtual learning activities scheduled by the general education teacher to offer support to learners. This SPED teacher will also follow up with students for a minimum of 30 minutes of small group instruction daily for ELA and Math and then at a minimum 1 time per week will meet 1:1 with each student for 30 minutes for 1:1 support. This does not include the additional virtual office hours that will also be provided. The SPED teacher will collaborate with the general education teacher and related service providers to accommodate the best time to hold these sessions.
- The district assessment calendar will be provided to all staff and parents/guardians so that the schedule of assessments is known and can be followed virtually. Links to complete assessments will be provided.

OPTION 2

Procedures for Submitting a Virtual Learning Request

ONLY AN OPTION IF - there is an in-person and virtual option due to a declared public health emergency, declared state of emergency, or a directive by the appropriate health agency or officer to institute a public health closure.

- 1. Parents/Guardians must complete the virtual learning registration paperwork two weeks prior to the start of the marking period in which they expect their child/children to begin the program as per the following dates:
 - 9/3/2024 Start of 1st Marking Period
 11/7/2024 Start of 2nd Marking Period
 1/29/2025 Start of 3rd Marking Period
 4/5/2025 Start of 4th Marking Period
- 2. Parents/guardians will be given a link to the registration document that must be completed prior to students starting in the virtual learning program.
- 3. Once the parent/guardian has completed the registration the district will review the document to ensure that it is complete and then the district will approve the student's full time learning request.
- 4. Students with disabilities that are registered in the full time virtual learning program will have their documents reviewed by the case manager to determine if an IEP meeting or amendment needs to be made to address this change.
- 5. Most answers to questions regarding the virtual learning program can be found in the virtual plan handbook. However if additional information is needed parents/guardians can contact their child(s) school or the Special Projects Office, which includes the Child Study Team. OPTION 2

In Person Learning Transition Plan

ONLY AN OPTION IF - there is an in-person and virtual option due to a declared public health emergency, declared state of emergency, or a directive by the appropriate health agency or officer to institute a public health closure.

Full time virtual learning may be an option for parents/guardians as directed by the Governor of New Jersey due to COVID-19. Parents/guardians who register their child/children for this program will be informed of all procedures that must be followed specific to distance learning. They will also receive information on the transition process back to in person instruction in the school. Students who participate in the virtual learning program may transition back to in person learning at the start of each marking period. These re entry dates are as follows:

11/6/2024 End of 1st Marking Period
 1/28/2025 End of 2nd Marking Period
 4/4/2025 End of 3rd Marking Period

Any parent/guardian who chooses to have their child/children return to in person instruction must notify the building principal in writing 2 weeks prior to the end of the marking period. All students who receive specialized services (SPED, 504, ELL, GATE, Related Services) will have these services scheduled in person upon their return. Collaboration among staff will assist in the smooth transition back. All students in PK-8 will have assessment data reviewed to determine any additional instructional needs upon the students return to in person learning.

Digital Platforms and Resources

Students will have access to digital learning devices in grades PK-8 and support will be provided to families who need internet access. A plan for device distribution has been developed and parents/guardians will be notified of the schedule. Students will access assignments through Google Classroom and SeeSaw. The delivery of instruction, as well as district meetings will be provided primarily through Zoom with other virtual communication resources also being implemented. In addition, correspondence via email, ClassDojo, and the district website will also be utilized. Staff, students, and parents/guardians are expected to regularly check these forms of communication for up to date information. Furthermore, the online assessment and supplemental learning platforms (LinkIt and Let's Go Learn will be utilized to assess students, analyze assessment data, and provide supplemental instruction in the areas of ELA and Math. Online assessment links will be shared with students and parents/guardians to complete assigned assessments which are highlighted on the district assessment calendar.

Content Delivery

Students will have access to virtual online learning materials and instructional activities to remain engaged in learning. During this time, we will adapt learning to provide experiences outside the classroom. This virtual education will include synchronous learning for OPTION 1 and both asynchronous, as well as synchronous learning activities for OPTION 2. Asynchronous learning is when a learner participates in an online learning session at different times. This allows the learner to do the work at their own pace. This may be used in a variety of ways for different students. Synchronous learning is when learners participate in an online learning course at the same time but in different locations. This allows students to interact with the instructor and each other. This is a virtual classroom and will be used to deliver instruction.

Blended virtual learning will be the primary basis of this plan and will include whole class direct instruction, independent learning (reading, writing, research, exercise, and projects), small group instruction, 1:1 instruction, follow up instruction, flipped lessons, video lessons, formative and summative assessments via the online LinkIt and Let's Go Learn platforms, teacher made online assessments, project based lessons, virtual labs and demonstration, interactive learning lessons, and hands on at home activities. Face to face instruction through Zoom, as well as Google Meet will address the whole group, small group, and 1:1 learning experiences. When available these lessons will be recorded in case a student is not able to participate live or would need to rewatch the lesson to complete the assignment.

The district curriculum will be followed so all NJ Standards areas are exposed to students based on their grade level expectations. Online materials will be provided, as well as hard copies of books, handouts, and kits when necessary will also be given to students. All grades PK-8 materials will be from the core programs students use during the school year. At the beginning of each week teachers will post weekly assignments and follow the schedule of classes.

Just as in person learning in our district, this virtual program will focus on making sure learners feel safe, nurtured, and challenged. Students' individual needs will always be considered and the charge will be to embrace each child's uniqueness as they grow academically, develop their character, and receive social emotional supports. The virtual program is a new way to engage students using innovative learning tools. The district will use a student centered approach to learning and will offer our students, as well as their parents/guardians the flexibility they need. Teachers will have ongoing communication with students. Lessons will be clearly posted with timelines for completion, either throughout the day or over several days. Under OPTION 2 there will be virtual lessons that are face to face and individualized weekly check ins. This daily live instruction and weekly conferencing under OPTION 2 will ensure students are receiving a full continuum of learning supports while participating in the virtual program. The district is committed to engaging students in critical thinking and dialoguing. The goal is to inspire students to embrace their academic achievements. As we promote student centered learning, the

delivery of instruction will be rigorous. The key is to develop strong relationships built on trust among all participants knowing that the mission to succeed academically, as well as socially and emotionally is essential. Developing a students foundation skills and building upon them will be an integral part of the virtual classroom. Supporting and guiding the whole child will lead to more productive, as well as contributing citizens in society.

The district is committed to providing equitable education for all students. Modified content delivery will occur for special education, 504 plan, at-risk (BSI/Title 1 students), and ELL students. Special education teachers will collaborate with general education teachers and CST case managers to determine individual student needs so that instructional supports being provided, including all necessary accommodations. BSI teachers will also be in constant communication with general education teachers to provide the most support to their students, especially during the small group instruction time during core subjects and the 1:1 time. Case managers will follow up with families to ensure services are being implemented in accordance with IEPs to the greatest extent possible. This will be done via phone, email, zoom, or Classdojo. Special education teachers, paraprofessionals, and related service providers will make weekly contact with students and/or parents/guardians. Students who require hard copies of school work or additional materials will receive them. Through social distancing, these materials will be distributed. A variety of differentiated activities will be provided remotely and student progress will be monitored. These same tasks will occur for at-risk (BSI/Title 1 students), 504, and ELL students. However, the general education teacher will spearhead these learning strategies for the 504 plan. The Basic Skills Instruction will put strategies in place for BSI/Title 1 students, with general education teacher, while the ELL teacher will address these areas for all ELL students using a variety of teaching methods. The ELL teacher will also collaborate with the general education teacher specific to identified ELL students to ensure ELLs have access to the same standard of education as non-ELL peers. There also will be opportunities for all students to have accelerated learning opportunities and/or extended learning opportunities daily 1:1 with their teacher.

Attendance Procedures and Reporting

All students registered to participate in the virtual learning program are required to engage daily in their assigned courses and classroom activities. The meaning of attendance changes in a virtual learning program. Virtual learning attendance is more about engagement and completion of assignments, not being physically present. If a student is sick the parent/guardian should notify the school just as they would for in person instruction. Teachers will take attendance daily and record this in the Genesis system. They will follow the mandate as noted in expectations for the number of completed assignments to attest for a full day present. This will be communicated with their students and parents/guardians in English and translated into Spanish for native Spanish guardians. Factors that will also be part of a students daily attendance include:

- Active Time Spent Logged in and Learning
- Submission of Assignments
- Participation and Engagement
- Tracked Work Time on Projects

• Teacher to Student Communication

Since tracking assignments virtually will be different. Teachers are asked to identify and log for each student the factors above to note academic progress. This tracking log (Appendix A) will be reviewed at the end of each marking period. The district guidance counselor will continue to collaborate with each virtual teacher to discuss students' attendance and address any concerns with parents/guardians via phone, email, and letters home. The district will consider safe, welfare checks that maintain social distancing to follow up on attendance concerns and deliver any necessary materials. The district SRO will assist in this capacity and will follow district policy specific to attendance and truancy. Accountability is expected by all virtual participants and this will be closely monitored and will be a factor in promotion, retention, discipline, and any other decisions that reflect the student's performance.

Teachers are asked to keep a contact log of phone calls, emails, ClassDojo, and virtual contacts and/or meetings with parents, including outcomes or highlights of this correspondence. The district virtual contact log (Appendix B) can be used for this and should be submitted every 2 weeks with your lesson plans. Teachers are asked to please make an attempt to contact all students' parents/guardians on a regular basis. If parents are not reachable, teachers are asked to notify their direct supervisor, guidance counselor, and CST case manager if applicable.

In addition, the district is required to report to the NJDOE data on students participating in the full time virtual learning program OPTION 2. This data must be reported based on the following subgroups:

- Economically Disadvantaged
- Race and Ethnic Group
- Students with Disabilities
- English Language Learners

Instructional Expectations and Supports

A student participating in the virtual learning program will be afforded the same quality and scope of instruction, as well as other educational services as any student would receive in person. Students with disabilities, as well as ELL students will also receive the same services they would receive if in person. SPED and 504 plan students will also receive related services as noted in their IEP or plan. This includes the same standards based instruction, quality and rigor of learning, educational technology, interventions, modifications and accommodations, and assessments. The school day, attendance policies, district policies, and expectations for learning will be adhered to for this program. Supports and resources will be provided and communicated ongoing to parents to ensure that all students, specifically younger students are meeting the expectations of this virtual program.

As a community of learners, the Egg Harbor City School District's shared expectations during our virtual learning program are as follows:

Elementary Students grades K-3

- Be responsible for your learning and know your schedule (as appropriate by age)
- Use ClassDojo and Google Classroom to access assignments and to post completed assignments.
- Complete a minimum of 3 activities out of 5 to receive attendance credit for the day.
- Attend video or phone conferences once a week to discuss targeted skills.
- Participate in Zoom and other video communication platforms or resources as planned by your teacher.
- Ask questions and share feelings.
- Follow the district technology acceptable use policy.

Elementary Teachers grades K-3

- Follow your contracted hours of 8:10 AM 3:10 PM and conduct/engage in online teaching during this time (see schedule) that includes direct instruction, grading, conferencing with students and parents (when needed), collaborating with colleagues, student outreach, and individual student weekly contact sessions.
- Provide students at the beginning of the week a list of activities.
- Submit your two week lesson plan to your direct supervisor the week prior to the start of the first lesson on the plan. Collaborate with other instructional staff at your grade level, including SPED ICR teachers, related service providers, guidance counselors, and the CST if applicable.
- Prepare and post a daily morning meeting message.
- Post essential questions or lesson objectives in Google Classroom and/or your video conferencing platform.
- Post the lesson activity at the indicated time on the schedule. Translate assignments, including materials and literacy level appropriate information as needed for ELLs
- Follow the virtual learning schedule and required learning time requirements for your grade level and provide daily remote office hours.
- Monitor and respond to each student's post/message within 24 hours encouraging feedback.
- Communicate and troubleshoot with students and parents/guardians who are struggling and inform the building principal, guidance counselor, and if applicable CST case manager of the same.
- Develop ways to meet individual students' needs and plans to differentiate instruction.
- Conference at a minimum 1 time per week with each student through video or phone.
- Record daily attendance and maintain records of interactions with students, parents/guardians, guidance counselors, and nurses.
- Conduct formative, as well as summative assessments and follow the district assessment calendar.

- Collaborate at least 1 time per week with your colleagues, specifically those providing in person instruction when possible to coordinate instructional activities, while following the district curriculum.
- Comply with the district expectations as per this plan handbook, including actively
 conducting online instruction during designated times, tracking grading, providing
 feedback, planning upcoming engaging lessons with varied activities to meet student

- Communicate regularly with your child(s) teacher and case manager if applicable.
- If you need additional support ask for this and contact your child(s) teacher, principal, guidance counselor, and case manager if applicable.
- Inform the school immediately of any technical difficulties.

- Check your email account at least 2 times per day.
- Complete a minimum of 3 activities out of 5 to receive attendance credit for the day.

- Participate in Zoom and other video communication platforms or resources as planned by your teacher.
- Ask questions and share feelings. Communicate with your teachers if you need additional support or need extra time.

- Collaborate with your peers.
- Follow the district technology acceptable use policy.

- If you need additional support ask for this and contact your child(s) teacher, principal, guidance counselor, and case manager if applicable.
- Inform the school immediately of any technical difficulties.

Varied supports will be provided for all students, parents/guardians, and staff. These supports will assist with virtual learning success. The district has teams in place that collaborate to support the needs of everyone involved in the virtual learning program. Teachers, specialized staff, guidance counselors, administration, and parents are part of this team. In order to support students' growth this team is continually adapting and making adjustments as needed.

General supports include the following:

- Professional development for faculty and staff that may include; best practices in core subjects, strategies for ELLs, SPED, GATE, and 504 students, SEL, culturally responsive teaching and learning, trauma informed teaching, new resources in technology.
- Continuous outreach to parents, which also includes schedule of activities, needed materials, technology resources, communication of needs, requirements for daily attendance, and an organized work space.
- Information on the requirements of this plan and procedures that support it.
- Resources to support learning, including videos with directions and further explanations.
- Short and to the point online lectures in live virtual classrooms, with video or slides as a resource for further review.
- Small group instruction for follow up or mini lessons.
- Ongoing feedback for projects.
- Breaks and shorter segments of instruction based on grade level.
- Virtual office hours daily.
- Weekly 1:1 follow up with each student.
- Clear explanation of weekly activities, assignments, assessments, due dates, and follow up sessions.
- Varied virtual communication (asynchronous or synchronous) using Zoom and/or other secondary options as listed in this handbook.

Special populations supports include the following:

- Students with disabilities will have lessons and assignments adapted based on their IEP, including addressing their goals/objectives, as well as accommodations and modifications. They will receive at a minimum, one 1:1 session each week throughout the virtual learning program. Most of this instruction will take place via Zoom, with supports from other virtual platforms, and Google Classroom will be used for additional learning opportunities.
- Any student with an IEP will still hold their annual IEP meetings, and any evaluations and other meetings to identify, evaluate, and/or reevaluate students with disabilities. Options for this occurrence may include via phone or zoom. Case managers will communicate with parents/ guardians in relation to meetings or testing.
- Students who are eligible for related services (counseling, speech/language, OT, & PT) will have these scheduled by the individual therapist as per the requirements in their IEP

- or 504 plan. Most of this instruction will take place via Zoom, with supports from other virtual platforms, and Google Classroom will be used for additional learning opportunities.
- At-risk counseling services will be provided and scheduled by the school guidance counselor.
- English Language Learners will receive services from the ELL teacher who will provide additional support related to ELA and instructional assignments. This instructor will provide group and individual sessions with students. Most of this instruction will take place via Zoom, with supports from other virtual platforms, and Google Classroom will be used for additional learning opportunities. A minimum of one 1:1 session each week is expected throughout the virtual learning program. In addition, support services for parent outreach in their home language will be provided.
- Let's Go Learn Edge will be used for online supplemental learning activities for both remediation and enrichment in ELA and Math. Students will have a login to access this. Assignments will be posted by the teacher and students can also go into the portal on their own to practice skills in ELA and Math.

Assessment and Grading

Please refer to the assessment calendar (Appendix C) for all district assessments. This will include the required online assessments for grades K-8 in the Linkit (Standards Based Benchmark) and Let's Go Learn (ELA and Math Skills Based) platforms (Appendix D), as well as the parent/guardian information on administering these tests at home (Appendix E - in English and Spanish). PK students will be assessed using Teaching Strategies Gold and students in kindergarten will also be assessed online with Educational Software for Guided Instruction (ESGI). Teachers will inform students of teacher made assessments based on the district curriculum and subjects being taught.

Teachers will also inform students, as well as parents/guardians on learning outcomes, including reviewing baseline data and progress monitoring. Final grades will be recorded on the student's report card, which will be distributed at the end of each marking period. Special education students will also receive a progress report with their report card specific to their IEP goals and objectives.

Health and Wellness Supports

Counseling Services

Students will receive their mandated an/or at-risk counseling through online platforms if needed. Character education and social emotional learning activities will also be implemented for all students. Guidance Counselors, the School Social Worker, and the School Psychologist will all have remote office hours as well. All at-risk interventions will be available to students and parents/guardians. Resources will also be provided for outreach programs. Counseling staff will consult with teachers regarding students' needs. Concerns regarding students demeanor,

behavior, attendance, social emotional well being, and/or academic struggles will be communicated and immediately addressed. Follow up will occur with students' parents/guardians. In addition, transition supports will occur for all students as needed, but specifically for 8th grade students who will be attending high school next year, as well as special education students who require a transition plan as per their IEP.

The district has an agreement with the Youth Advocacy Program. This affords students that qualify for additional counseling services. Virtual and in-person services from the YAP worker will be offered this school year to all eligible students in the distance learning program. These services will be scheduled during the school day with the student's parent/guardian and in collaboration with the guidance counselors and school social worker.

All staff will also have check-ins with their supervisors and receive counseling services as needed.

Qualifications and Counseling Services from a YAP Counselor:

Program Overview and Updates

- Students are required to have Medicare or Medicaid to be eligible for services
- Current YAP Service protocols require only initial verbal consent from parent in order to initiate/ continue counseling services for the upcoming school year
- Individual student scheduling for services will be conducted by the school counselors and/or school social worker

Virtual Format

- Distance counseling sessions can be conducted either through Zoom or Google Meet
- Distance counseling schedule is flexible and can be initiated as soon as needed, following parental verbal consent
- Referral for distance counseling will be conducted by the school counselors and/or school social worker

Virtual Nursing Services

- Google Classroom activities will be scheduled for health lessons in grades K-3.
- Class Dojo will be used for communication purposes.
- Zoom will be used for face to face health checks and student, as well as parent/guardian contacts
- Nurses will be available to conduct COVID-19 trainings and report updates in the are of health and wellness. This will be done both virtually and through video correspondence, including webinars.

Food Services

The district will follow the plan below to distribute safe delivery of meals to students impacted by virtual or remote instruction. This would include both breakfast and lunch meals. Options for picking up meals while social distancing and also providing remote pick up locations within the community have been arranged.

Food will be distributed with multiple meals being included for each student to cover a week's worth of food. The district food service company will work closely with district staff to disseminate these meals. Food distribution will occur on Mondays with 3 days of food covering breakfast and lunch, as well as on Thursdays with 4 ½ days of food including breakfast and lunch, which also gets the student through the weekend and Monday morning. Weekly distribution of food will occur as follows:

Mondays and Thursdays at the EHCCS - 1:45 PM to 2:30 PM Mondays and Thursdays at the EHC Public Library - 1:00 PM to 1:30 PM Mondays and Thursdays at the Washington Ave. Apartments - 1:30 PM to 2:00 PM

Transportation

In the case of hybrid programming where a student is coming into the building all students who are entitled to transportation in their IEP or due to distance will continue to receive the bus.

21st Century Community Learning Center Program/ Extra-Curricular programs

In case of virtual or remote instruction our 21st CCLC REACH program will continue virtually. Allowing for students to participate in a variety of activities, including hands-on with live teachers. The district will also think of creative ways to involve all parents throughout the period in virtual family experiences.

Childcare/ Community Programming

Upon request the district can assist families in finding resources in the community.

Credit Recovery

Not applicable as we are a Pre-K to 8th district.

Building Maintenance

In the case of remote learning virtual or hybrid all buildings will be maintained throughout the period. In the case of hybrid learning the responsibility of the Supervisor of Buildings and Grounds will include taking appropriate measures to minimize, to the greatest extent possible, the risk of viral transmission in the school facilities with vigorous cleaning policies and practices which include (but are not limited to) on a daily basis: Filling of soap and hand sanitizers, ensuring all paper towel holders are filled and functioning at all times, sweeping and wet mopping of all floors, vacuuming of rugs, cleaning and sanitizing of hard surfaces including fountains, door knobs, work areas, computer keyboards, counter tops, railings, stairwells, etc., cleaning and sanitizing of bathrooms - toilets, sinks, walls, floors, cleaning and sanitizing of

cafeterias - kitchen, tables, chairs, food lines, and cleaning of vents. The Supervisor of Buildings and Grounds with the assistance from the Business Administrator, assures the provision of power, heat and ventilation, water, sewer, and janitorial services. In the event of a school closure the Supervisor of Buildings and Grounds will be responsible for scheduling custodians as necessary.

District (Virtual) Remote Learning Policy 6173.1

All parents/guardians will have access to the district virtual learning policy and plan handbook. These will be accessible on the district website. Communication with families in their home language will be made via phone contact to review both the policy and plan handbook. Components of the plan handbook will be provided to parents in their home language as needed. This plan handbook will include information on procedures to submit a full time virtual learning request, request to return to in person learning, the scope and expectations of the virtual program, communication procedures, and contact information for additional questions and/or concerns.
