# Tax Cut (local school tax)

 The average home in EHC is assessed at \$121,500 per the City Tax Assessor

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The average homeowner in EHC will see a **\$35.96 reduction** on their tax bill (as it relates to the local school tax portion only)

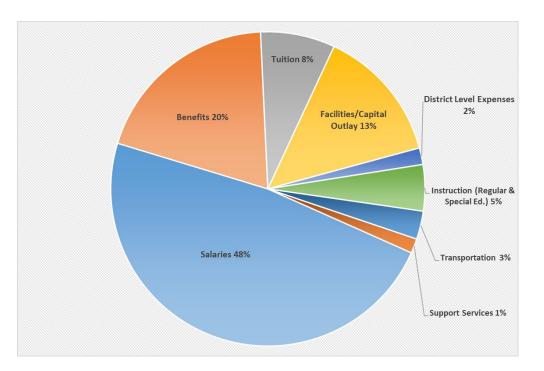

Retain all current year positions. All COVID-19 grant fund will be depleted by September 2024. The Bipartisan Stronger Connections Grant allows for us to offset some positions.

•(1) Additional Part-Time Relief Teacher in Preschool

•(1) Retain Part-Time technical assistance position to help our Technology Coordinator

LED Lighting at the Community School

 Anticipated to begin Chiller Project with ROD Grant and Lease purchase of equipment at the Community School

•Visitor Management Systems at both buildings (Bipartisan Stronger Connections Grant)

•New interior doors, additional electrical outlets for dehumidifier drainage, and flooring replacements at Spragg

Possible playground upgrades at Spragg (we applied for the Local Recreation Improvement Grant last month)

Addition of a Cross Country team
